TVLP Joint Council Meeting - Oct. 12, 2021

The Trinity Valley Lutheran Parish joint councils met on Tuesday, Oct. 12, 2021 at 6:30p.m. at St. John's fellowship hall. Members present: Pastor Amelia Houdek, Ray Dohm, Nancy Cleveland, Mary Jane Hecker, Phil Verges, Dale Place, Rob Moore, Dawn Schmitt, David Butts, Mark Kotten, Leanna Larson, Melanie Wentlandt, Stacy Burr, Lisa Nelson, Dianne Hurtgen, Linda Anderson, Shawn Miller, Barb Esanbock, Shelli Wood.

In the absence of Parish council president, Karen Gunderson, the meeting was led by Pastor Amelia Houdek who called us to order shortly after 6:30 p.m. She led us in an exercise to determine the connection, call, and commitment we feel as church leaders and members of our parish and followed with prayer.

A motion was made by Dale Place to accept the September minutes, it was seconded and carried. Pastor Amelia's report had been sent to each member of the councils for preview prior to the meeting. There were no questions or concerns from the council. A motion was made by Ray Dohm, seconded by David Butts to approve the pastor's report as presented. Motion carried.

Next on the agenda was a discussion regarding the article "From the Age of Association to Authenticity" which addresses the impact of shifting trends towards affiliation and participation in the church. Even prior to the Covid pandemic, participation and membership has been declining in most every church nationwide as many people, especially younger ones, don't have strong connections or involvement with the church anymore. This will require us to examine the way we do ministry going forward and make the changes to address the needs of all ages.

A stewardship meeting was held on Oct. 11th. Pastor Amelia is working on a letter to be mailed out to every household along with a commitment card inviting us to strengthen and nurture our Christian faith and commitment. Though there will be no formal sermon series during stewardship month in November, Pastor hopes to be able to offer an on-line midweek reflection. Then, on November 21st, the focus of the service will be on re-commitment. Please look for that mailing by November 1st and prayerfully consider how you will challenge yourselves to be good stewards.

The *Parish* Council, along with the treasurers/bookkeepers of all 3 churches, will meet October 25th at 6:30p.m. at St. John's to discuss the 2022 budget for the parish.

The next Joint Council meeting will be held on November 9th at 6:30 at St. John's with the individual councils meeting either before or after the joint meeting.

Upcoming Events include: The Spring Lake Fall Festival on Oct. 17th at 11:00 a.m.; Presentation of Bibles to 3rd graders at all 3 churches on Oct. 24th; and Confirmation on Oct. 31st at Gilman and St. John's, where a total of 10 young people will affirm their baptism.

Melanie Wentlandt commended Pastor Amelia for the success of the recent confirmation retreat and reported that the kids were energized and engaged. There were no other questions or concerns raised, and so a motion was made by Dale Place, seconded by Ray Dohm to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. The joint council meeting was adjourned at 7:15 p.m. and individual councils met.
